#### June Guest Speaker—Dean Holland




June's speaker Dean Holland provided an amazing insight into creating a "personal photographic project" and the reasons every photographer should have one.

Dean shared with us his view that personal projects could solve the old age issuer of GAS (Gear Acquisition Syndrome) by focusing your attention to a particular area and limiting the need for equipment that you might not yet have.

Dean's presentation style is always unbelievably engaging and his use of the voting function during our presentation was used to terrific effect in challenging our stereotypes – a brilliant segway into Dean's own personal photography venture, the 'Stereotype Project'.

Dean talked us through the background to the project and shared his behind the scenes images for capturing images for his Stereotype Project, proving necessity was the mother of all invention and demonstrating how camping equipment could be used to create neutral backgrounds in situations where space and weight (due to travel) restrictions were the order of the day!

#### Martin's Focus Group—Ben Stoffl on Post Processing

Our June 2020 Focus Group welcomed back Ben Stoffl who demonstrated some of his post processing techniques. Ben was our first Zoom guest speaker in April this year, where he showed off some of his amazing imagery as part of his talk on putting together a portfolio. As a result of this we invited Ben back to show us his post processing workflow and tips and tricks that helped create his incredible final images that popped off the page!

This month we tried something a little different where a few members kindly presented some of their RAW images for both Ben and other members to process. While Ben demonstrated his post processing techniques on the night, we gave all members the option to also undertake their own post processing on the images ahead of the night. The intention was to see these processed images and compare Ben's final image with the rest of our final results.

The four images that Ben will process are:

- 1. Russian Sunset by Phil Lawrence
- 2. Great Ocean Road by Tony Fitzgerald
- 3. Just Another Day At Work by Joy Melchiori
- 4. Welsh Church by Anne Pappalardo

Ben did a great job in getting the best out of all these images. However, it was really interesting to see the different interpretations put on by the different members from the same RAW file. The same base image created a number of different interpretations with some cropping in, others converting to monochrome and others letting the primary image stand alone with minimal processing all to create a different mood and tell a different story.

We'd like to thank Ben once again for giving his time generously to the club and sharing his skills with all our members.

In July we have a special workshop presentation from internationally acclaimed landscape and aerial photographer Mieke Boynton. Mieke is a full-time professional photographer and has won numerous International awards including the prestigious Epson International Pano Awards. She is a member of the

This month we trialled presenting images within each competition in award order rather than in our usual random judging order. This is the method native to MyPhotoClub, and is preferred by many judges. Both methods have their advantages and disadvantages, but members on the whole were pleasantly surprised.

Entries for Looking down and Open close on July 2; after that it will be time to start thinking about Close-up and Open for August. Both of these are DPI only competitions. Please be sure to check the definitions in MyPhotoClub. And the year is galloping on – don't forget about Three Related Images (probably DPI only, to be confirmed) and Annual Audio Visuals, due on Sept 3. 
