


Scapes was again our first set subject of the year, with Mel Sinclair reprising her role from two years ago as our expert judge. 'Scapes' is a popular topic, and most members chose to enter two Scapes images and 1 Open image, even though this year we have the option to do things the other way around. Mel's concise and helpful comments are also available in MyPhotoClub, an added bonus for those who couldn't make the evening.

It was helpful that this year the Scapes definition (as provided for the Qld Interclub DPI competition later in the year) clarified that animals or humans may be included as long as they are not the main focus, since they may give a sense of scale to the image. Members also certainly took advantage of the ability to 'involve closer shots of features of these environments', which did give rise to some discussion in the break about just how close the shot can be before it stops being a scape.

Next month's challenge will be to unravel the differences between Animals and Nature. Check the definitions! DPI entries (for Animals and Open) and print entries (for Nature and Open) are due at the Speaker night on March 9th.

Next month we also look forward to seeing images from our Tri Nations partners Westville Camera Club in South Africa and Stoke Poges in the UK, in our annual interclub competition.
