### **Australian Cup**

Hosted by Australian Photographic Society with results Zoomed Sunday 31 July

The results of the Australian Cup will be zoomed this month. This is another inter-club competition (note the Zoomed results happen the day after River City!), looking for the best images from Australian Photographic Club members both as a club and as individual members. There will be 10 awards for clubs and 29 awards for individual photographers and the judging will be done by three international judges. Each entry is made up of 20 images. ### **Focus**

Finalising your photo book and Printing Mini-Masterclass, Thursday 2 June, Kenmore Library Anne Pappalardo, Louise McDonald, John Arthur Little, Ray Shorter

Photographic printing is alive and well if the number of attendees at this Focus Meeting was any indication. It might have been freezing outside but Kenmore Library was toasty and welcoming for a big group of QCGers looking to learn more about finessing their printed images.

Anne Pappalardo started proceedings with the second part of a presentation aimed at fine tuning a photobook before it goes to print. It was also an opportunity for members to look at the Momento Pro camera club kit which amongst other things had printed samples of paper stock available via Momento Pro—a handy resource and a great tool when helping to decide that all-important question of what will be best for your collection of images.

Next Louise McDonald walked us through her workflow for producing exhibition-ready fine art prints. Louise brought along samples of her exhibition prints, both framed and under glass, and one image printed on fine art rag which was absolutely breathtaking. So interesting to have the opportunity to view Louise's stunning landscapes printed in large format on quality paper stock.


John Arthur Little spoke next on how he best produces printed images and the myriad things which can impact on your final output including calibrating your monitor and the amount of light present in the space in which you edit your images. John also brought along his magnificent exhibition-ready prints.

Lastly Ray Shorter talked us through how to soft proof an image before it is printed, using both Lightroom and Photoshop. This was accompanied by a demonstration in Lightroom and a few ah-ha moments from the crowd. See overleaf for details of the handout prepared on soft-proofing.

### Soft-Proofing Images with ICC Paper/Printer Profiles from a Commercial Printer



Ray Shorter along with his mate David Jones from Brisbane Camera Group has prepared a written 'how to' guide on how to obtain ICC profiles from your printer, and then how to use these profiles at the final stage in your post processing.

Soft-proofing allows the maker to select the paper stock on which they plan to print their image and then view their digital image as it will appear using this stock.

The image can then be further edited to mitigate any unwanted changes the choice of stock may bring to the printed work.

As Ray explained at his Focus presentation, he made the 'how to' guide to aid his own memory on the process and we are lucky that he has shared this excellent resource.

The guide can be accessed via the club's My Photo Club webpage and is located under 'Help Documents' (see screenshot above which will help you locate the tab).

# Speaker Review

My Journey as Professional Photographer with Bruno Domingues, Thursday 9 June

Bruno Domingues (right) is a Brisbanebased fashion photographer who has a special link to QCG. One of his favourite models (he thinks of her more as a sister) is one of *our* favourite models— Annaliese (see one of Bruno's shots of her overleaf).

In addition to this link, Nick Lefebvre from QCG is also a fan of the photo walks which Bruno organises (often featuring Annaleise but also a wide range of models for all participants to photograph) so for many in the audience, Bruno's presence and some of his images felt very familiar.

On this cold night in June, Bruno gave a terrific and candid presentation on his journey as a professional photographer. Being made redundant from a career in IT was the push he needed to turn his passion into his profession and Bruno was more than happy to share the ups and downs of working in an industry which is being undermined by, amongst other things, photographers prepared to work for free.

On Bruno's journey, he shared how and why he eventually decided to specalise in portraits and people photography, the exemplars who have inspired him, his efficient post processing workflow which means his clients often receive their images on the day they are shot (wow), and where he would like to see his work heading (high-end, black and white).



River City Prints is an annual interclub competition which has traditionally focused on clubs in South-East Queensland. Inaugurated in 2000 by Wynnum Bayside Camera Club, the competition was originally between Wynnum Bayside, Brisbane Camera Group, Mt Gravatt Photographic Society and Queensland Camera Group. From 2006 the competition was opened to all South-East Queensland camera clubs and in 2022, after a two year hiatus primarily due to uncertainties around Covid-19, QCG as host has opened it up to <a href="mailto:any-psq">any-psq</a> affiliated club, wherever they are located.

The impact judging of this competition will take place on Saturday 30 July at SPACE from 1.30 pm. Entry will cost \$10 and includes afternoon tea. 
