

#### Speaker - My Photographic Journey

Tryg Helander AAPS PSQA B.FET (Photo), Dip. Photography, Dip. Photoimaging, Thursday 12 October, F2F @ SPACE and Zoomed.

Our October speaker was the irrepressible and always entertaining Tryg Helander. Tryg admitted he was mystified as to why the club asked him to speak on his photographic journey.

"I've got heaps of workshop topics I could run for you," he enthused.

But as president Martin Riley said in his introduction, QCG was keen to learn the story behind the man who has so often judged for us and so actively contributed to the amateur photography scene in Queensland. It was also an opportunity for us to learn the backstories to some of Tryg's iconic images.

When Tryg was small, he told us his mum was always trying to find an activity to keep him busy. She bought him his first camera (film) and happily arranged for the processing of his many images. But it was his step father—a professional photographer—bought him his first 'proper' camera and taught him to develop his own prints which Tryg described as 'like a wonderland'.

A highlight of the night was when Tryg confessed that he had been trying his hand at bird photography. As a (very talented and experienced) PSQ judge, Tryg coined the derisive phrase 'another bird on a stick' and encouraged our bird photographers to provide him something more than a beautiful bird perched perfectly for the camera!

He now admits that after giving bird photography a go, alongside the esteemed Steve Parish, he now has a new respect for all bird photographers and appreciates how difficult it can be to 'simply' capture that bird on a stick!

Which was one of the key messages of Tryg's presentation: to keep trying new genres—it keeps your photography fresh and life interesting.

Although we suspect life is always interesting for Tryg...

#### **Competitions Update**

A change is as good as a holiday.

Whilst many of our club members were hanging out in Iceland, Ireland, Croatia and Brisbane looking for light to reflect in new and novel ways, three members were judging our Photoshoot and Open DPI and Prints.

It is not an easy task to judge your peers, friends and fellow club members. Many thanks to Gaye Edwards, Margaret Whyte and Lynda Davidson for your bravery to take on this important task. For every single image something positive was mentioned. I summarised a couple of the key themes that did come through in the positive and constructive feedback and reflected that it was, as always, a good reminder to look at our images, keeping the basics in mind.

In summary, I took away a couple of points from the feedback.

- 1. Point of focus where is it? And are your viewers led to it? Is the point of interest sharp.
- 2. Angle of shot go down low, get down to the subjects eye level.
- 3. Tidy image look for distractions and remove them.
- 4. Tone
- 5. Texture and shape
- 6. Tell the story.

I'm sure there were more points to reflect on. This really reminded me of Ansel Adams who said:

"To photograph truthfully and effectively is to see beneath the surfaces."

I hope you all enjoyed the slight change to the norm. Again, a shout out to the three wise women.

#### QCG Member Survey 2023







How satisfied are you with this year's mix of delivery options? <sup>39 responses</sup>





Congratulations to the winners of the APS's eighth photobook competition, announced via Zoom this month by organiser Paul Balfe.

First in the travel category was Robin Mood with her book 'Antarctica – Journey to the Sublime!' and first in the open category was street photographer Adrian Wear with his book, 'Detour'.



There were 23 entries in total, with nine in travel and fourteen in open and two collective club entries.

Libby Jeffrey from Momento Pro, who was one of the judges along with Pia Jesson and Damian Caniglia, said she enjoyed the process of judging and that the quality of entries has easily improved, year on year.

She said the books were more professional, with a more cohesive design overall. Libby also mentioned the integration of text, as an important element of the books, was where some books needed improvement.

Second places went to Ross High for 'Not Just High' (Travel) and Di East for 'Finn and Diamond Slayer' (Open).

A hearty congratulations also to BCG's Ian Brewster who placed third in open with his hand-made book, 'A book of birds' and to QCG's Anne Pappalardo who placed third in travel with 'New York People and Places'.

QCG in 2024 will run its own photo book competition, timed so that members can enter both our competition and the APS competition, which is free and open to everyone, not just APS members. So get planning now!

#### What's involved:

In its current form, every month you assemble stories from various contributors, and write the stories that don't have an organiser/author. Martin Riley, Peter Moodie, Elizabeth Riley, Gaye Edwards all contribute set pieces. Tony FitzGerald provides the photos. You fill in the blanks. Prism comes out once a month.

#### What skills are needed:

I don't have layout skills but I'm comfortable stringing words together, so that helps. If you can layout a basic page and put some words down, you're qualified. I use Microsoft Publisher to put the newsletter together, and it is easy and flexible to use.

#### How much time does it take:

My workflow is that after each QCG event, I write or layout the page in Prism for that event. In that way, by the end of the month, Prism is almost finished and just needs a tidy up.

#### How come there are never any mistakes in Prism:

It's because Elizabeth Riley and Nick Lefebvre proof read it. Hopefully they will stick around to help with this job, and I can help too.

#### What resources are available to make it shine:

I have a whole library of photos and logos which I can transfer to you.


